

USGA RULES GOVERN ALL PLAY

In addition the following Local Rules are in effect:

- **Out of Bounds:** Defined by inside points, at ground level, of white stakes and boundary fence posts, (Rule 27-1). All public roads are deemed **out of bounds**. If a ball crosses a public road and comes to rest on another part of the course it is deemed **out of bounds**.
- **Water and Lateral Water Hazards:** When a water hazard or a lateral water hazard is defined by only one side, it is deemed to extend to infinity. When a water hazard or lateral water hazard is bounded by out of bounds, the hazard margin extends to and coincides with the out of bounds line.
- **Embedded ball** rule is in effect “through the green” as prescribed in Appendix I.
- **Abnormal Ground Conditions and Ground Under Repair: (Rule 25-1)**
 - Areas defined by enclosed white lines.
 - French drains, which are exposed trenches filled with rocks or stones.
 - Through the green, **seams of cut turf** (not the turf itself) are deemed to be ground under repair. However, interference by a seam with the player’s stance is deemed not to be, of itself, interference under Rule 25-1.
- **Obstructions:** All artificially surfaced roads and paths, and white-lined areas tying into these roads and paths are **immovable obstructions**, (Rule 24-2). Stones in bunkers are **movable obstructions**, (Rule 24-1). Note: Artificial rock retaining walls on Holes #5 and #6 are deemed **integral parts of the course** – no free relief.
- Wood chips and mulch are considered **loose impediments**, (Rule 23-1).
- Although the hazard stakes may not clearly indicate this, the margin of the hazard left of the cart path across the bridge on the **18th hole**, is to be considered the edge of the cart path.
- **Ground Under Repair; Play Prohibited:** The turf nurseries defined by white lines and located between #2 & #8 fairway and left of #12 are ground under repair from which **play is prohibited**.
- **Ball Drop on #17:** If a ball is in or it is known or virtually certain that a ball is in the water hazard (yellow stakes), the player may proceed under Rule 26; **or** as an additional option, drop a ball, under penalty of one stroke, in the dropping zone.
